And while nearly one third of states provide some abortion coverage with state Medicaid dollars, data from the U.S. Census indicate that today, nearly half of Latinas and approximately 70 percent of Black women—and a majority of all women of colorlive in states where Medicaid coverage of abortion care is denied in cases beyond those of life endangerment, rape, and incest.

We ask you, Mr. President, join us in standing up for the ability of women to make personal health decisions without interference.

The time is now. These policies have harmed our families, our communities, and our health for far t oo long. We urge you to eliminate all abortion coverage restrictions in your FY 2016 budget.
